TAKE NOTICE—

*1. That leave to enter Zimbabwe is refused in terms of—

~~*(a) paragraph () of subsection (3) of section 12 of the Act;~~

*(b) paragraph (b) of section 17 of the Act;

A.R.W SECT 31(1) b.

~~*(c) subsection (1) of section 18 of the Act.~~

~~*2. That you are a prohibited person in terms of—~~

~~*(a) paragraph () of subsection (1) of section 14 of the Act;~~

~~*(b) subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (f) of subsection (1) of section 14 of the Act.~~

~~*Immigration officer to delete or complete as appropriate.~~

You are notified that, in terms of subsection (1) of section 21, as read with subsection (1) of section 22 of the Act, you may appeal to the nearest Magistrate's Court—

- (a) if you have been notified that leave to enter Zimbabwe has been refused, on any grounds relating to the question of whether you were properly refused leave to enter; or
- (b) if you have been notified that you are a prohibited person in terms of paragraph (a), (h) or (k) of subsection (1) of section 14 of the Act, on the grounds of identity only; or
- (c) if you have been notified that you are a prohibited person in terms of subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (f) of subsection (1) of section 14 of the Act, on the grounds of identity or on the question of whether you have been convicted of an offence specified in Part II of the First Schedule to the Act; or
- (d) if you have been notified that you are a prohibited person in terms of any other provision of subsection (1) of section 14 of the Act, on any grounds relating to the question of whether you are a prohibited person.

If you have been refused leave to enter Zimbabwe, you are not entitled to enter or remain in Zimbabwe for the purpose of noting or prosecuting your appeal, making representations to the Minister or being present at the hearing hereof, but may be represented at your appeal by a legal practitioner.

Your appeal may be noted—

- (a) if you have been refused leave to enter or are outside Zimbabwe when you receive this notice, not later than ten days, Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays excluded, after receiving this notice;
- (b) if you are in Zimbabwe when you receive this notice, not later than three days, Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays excluded, after receiving this notice;

and must be noted in Form I.F. 21 which may be obtained from any immigration officer.

The provisions of sections 48 to 58 of the Immigration Regulations, 1979, are to be adhered to in the event of the submission of an appeal.
